

More than 350 in 2023: From Time Immemorial to 1673 to 2023 is an MRHHA initiative framed around the upcoming 350th anniversary of the establishment of trans-Atlantic relations and a permanent Cree-European centre of exchange in the Moose River. Working with the MRHHA's Executive Director, Board, and various committees, the successful candidates will help develop this anniversary initiative as a means of advancing the MRHHA's mission of building a future with our shared past. Building from this anniversary, we wish to celebrate the deeper history since time immemorial of the Mooso Sibi Illiliwak, including the heritage and tradition of hospitality, that has seen many diverse people welcomed into Moose Cree territory, friendships and families for centuries. We see this as a unique, once-in-a-generation opportunity to advance a range of community and economic development goals in close partnership with our co-founding jurisdictional members (Moose Cree First Nation, MoCreebec Eyoud Council, and the Town of Moosonee); in collaboration with other partners and supporters in and beyond our communities, especially Wakenagun Community Futures Development Corporation (the primary funder of these positions); and, above all, with input and engagement of grassroots community members.
